Commemoration of the 80th anniversary of victory in Europe

Thursday 8 May marked the eightieth anniversary of the end of World War 2 in Europe. Those of you who watch TV will have seen the many events that took place around the world.

In Cape Town, the Legion acknowledged the occasion by arranging an exhibition at the Castle of Good Hope and a very well attended Commemorative Service on Saturday 10th May where Alderman Ian Nielsen delivered the address and the band of Christel House School provided the music. In attendance was 98-year-old Joe Wilkinson, who served in the Royal Navy having signed up when he was 16, the minimum age being 17.

The exhibition included interviews conducted by volunteer convener Marina Hall with WW2 veterans who are still with us, including branch member 98-year-old Ian Campbell, and material on the many unacknowledged contributors to the South African war effort such as the Native Corp, the Coloured servicemen and SAMWAS. Many interesting WW2 artefacts were displayed, and the exhibition was visited by both local and overseas visitors to the Castle.

What happens to the funds raised by the Poppy Day Collection?

The Poppy Day Collection is the Branch's major fundraising effort towards veterans in need. These veterans are generally living on the streets or in shelters or perhaps in subsidized accommodation. The collection funds the following welfare activities:

- Monthly comfort parcels
 These parcels are provided to some 70 veterans and include necessities
 such as soap, toilet paper and deodorant and some nice to haves which
 might be a chocolate bar, a packet of chips and a cooldrink.
 Veterans at the following establishments receive support: The Salvation
 Army (Beth Rogelim), Sunnyside Lodge, Sunshine Club at Valkenberg and
 Happy Valley Shelter in Simonstown.
- Casual relief
 Veterans in need are allowed to call at Rosedale once a year and receive a
 gift card currently valued at R200,00. During 2024 those assisted totalled
 136.
- Other
 From time-to-time requests for once-off assistance such as repairs to hearing aids are received or contributions towards assistive devices.


